### This Month's Speakers

This month we will have three speakers participating in a Round Robin. Below are brief biographies on each of our speakers:

### Sue Fordyce

Sue also has traveled extensively throughout the United States and Canada speaking on Orchid Culture and Cattleya Breeding. Sue is a past President of DVOS and has been published in many orchid publications and is known for her humorous orchid poetry.

### Bernice Lindner

While working in a lab at UC Berkeley, I was intrigued by a flower that seemed to stay in bloom forever. The owner of the plant (Phal. aphrodite), realizing that I was interested, offered to sell me the

orchid for \$2.00. That was 1975, and as they say"the rest is history". It's been a great hobby-tons of fun, some neat collecting trips to Costa Rica, Ecuador, Peru and Panama, many good friends and much satisfaction. I no longer bore my friends to death with stories and pictures of our grandkids-now it is orchids that have stolen their place.

### Culture Corner

Last month, Michael Gallagher presented an overview of 'Growing Disas in the East Bay'. This session dealt with primarily Disa Uniflora, and the following recommendations were made with this species in mind. Disas are heavy water drinkers and need damp good quality water conditions. Although you can grow Disas by hand watering, he recommends an automated set-up. Because 'life happens' and someday you just won't have the time to water your Disas and they will die. Due to limited space I'll refer you to his web site www.disas.com <a href="http://www.disas.com">http://www.disas.com</a> for details on constructing a flow table. You can grow some species of Disas in full sun, but you will need to protect them from the extreme heat conditions that can occur. You can do this with misters or, for this reason, he recommends growing them outdoors under a shade structure and using misters. Disas can be found surviving in snow, so they will do fine in our temperate winter conditions. But they need protection from hard Generally giving them some freezes. protection during a hard freeze (~20°F) such as covering them or moving them close to the house will be sufficient.

Because water quality is essential for Disas it is important to watch the dissolved salts content in the water, referred to as 'parts per million' or ppm. Adding fertilizer will increase the salt levels of your Monitoring water. done with a 'Total Dissolved Salts' (TDS) meter or similar measuring device. You should not exceed 250 dissolved in salt content, staying under 200 is even better. Those of us that have EBMUD for our water supplier are fairly lucky in that the water out of the tap rarely exceeds 40 ppm. Those of you who have Contra Costa Water are not as fortunate and may need to resort to reverse osmosis water filtration systems or bottled water to grow disas.

From seed to bloom, it takes only 2 years for Disas. Too whet your appetite, below is a picture of Michael's greenhouse in July. For more details on growing Disas see Michael's web site www.disas.com



### News from Afar




WHAT YOU NEED TO WEAR: Hawaiian shirts, sandals and beach wear. Those not attired in beach wear will be forced to dance the hula for the club's entertainment.

- 1. Take Central Lafayette/Oakhill Road Exit.
  Take right at bottom of off-ramp onto Oakhill Road.
- At stop light take left onto Mt Diablo Blvd
- 1 block to next stop light turn right onto Moraga Road (World Savings Bank on corner).
- 1 long block turn Left onto Moraga Blvd (Marshall's cleaners on the left)-if you pass Lafayette Elementary School you've gone too far.
- I block to stop sign-take a right at First Street.
- 1/2 block turn Left onto Monroe Ave.
- 7. As Monroe begins to turn you will see a telephone post with two reflector strips on the right. Immediately after the telephone post are two brick gates -that's us the drive way is about 400 ft.

FROM WALMUT CREEK - Take Highway 24 West

1. Take Central Lafayette Exit. As you exit
the freeway continue to bear to the right
until you go under the freeway, you're now on
First Street.

- Continue straight through stop light. (Taco Bell will be on right hand corner.)
- At the bottom of the hill take a right onto Golden Gate Way and an immediate Left onto First Street.
- 1/2 block beyond stop sign turn left onto Monroe Ave.
- 5. As Monroe begins to curve on the right hand side you will see a telephone pole with two reflector strips on it, just beyond this pole is our driveway, turn between the brick posts the house is about 400 feet down the drive
