This Month's Speaker Rob Terry

Rob Terry has been growing orchids for ten years after getting started with a science fair project for his oldest daughter when she was in the eighth grade. It was a successful exploration into colchicine treatment of orchid seeds. One thing led to another and soon Rob purchased an orchid business, now called Sherwood Orchids; the previous owner wanted to move on to other, more important matters. Rob's primary interest is in the Lady Slipper orchids with most of his collection devoted to Paphs and Phrags. Rob is moving on more and more Phrags while exploring different opportunities in the orchid world

Rob and his wife are in the process of building a new, larger greenhouse for their expanding collection, and have numerous stories to tell about the trials and tribulations of greenhouse construction. However, this lecture is intended to give the listener all the basic information on how to grow Phragmipediums very successfully. Bring your pencil and paper to jot down the secrets he will share with you. If you snooze you lose.

Culture News

In January Dennis Olivas gave an informative demonstration on transplanting paphiopedilums. The following are some of the highlights from his presentation:

Dennis uses fine seedling bark and #3 perlite in a 4:1 ratio. He adjusts his media to accommodate his once a week watering schedule. If a plant tends to need watering more frequently, he will apply a layer of chopped sphagnum moss to the top to keep it moist longer and accommodate weekly watering.

Dennis recommends repotting once a year. New roots start to develop after the flower

Yummy Recipes

Ah!! Winter's here and we're freezing! Remember Summer? Remember the wonderful warm day of the DVOS BBQ? Remember I said I'd share recipes? Well here are some more! - Kathy Barrett

Francisco Baptista's Portuguese Milk Pudding (Very much like Flan)

1 liter milk 12 eggs 2 cups sugar 1 grated rind of lemon (fresh)

1 1/2 cups melted sugar to coat the bottom of the mold

Mix ingredients by hand (do not use mixer). Use a round baking mold with a center hole. Coat the inside of the mold with the melted sugar, do not let the sugar get cold. Put the mixed ingredients into mold and place into a deep baking pan with about

1 1/2 inches of water in pan.

Bake in 400F oven for 1 hour and cool for about five minutes; then place in refrigerator overnight.

Prepare for serving by turning over onto a serving plate.

CALICO BEANS

The recipe came without a name, and [blush] I forgot who gave it to me, so please tell me and I'll announce it at the meeting!! You should get credit!!

1/2 pound hamburger
1/2 pound bacon (cut up)
1/2 c. chopped onion
1 tsp salt
1 tsp mustard
2 tsp vinegar
3/4 c brown sugar
1 can kidney beans
1 can pork n beans
1 can lima (or butter) beans
1 c (or less) water

Cook burger and bacon till done, add onions and cook till clear. Add other ingredients and bake at 350 F for 40 minutes.

Once again DVOS will create a display for the San Francisco Orchid Show. DVOS has created award-winning displays for several years in a row. Come help us create our version of 'Night in the Tropics'. No experience nor talents needed. We will train you on the spot! We need people to write labels, set-up props, etc. If you can help, just come to Fort Mason on Wed. Feb. 20, 2002. Doors officially open for set-up at noon. We are usually there until 10 PM setting up, so if you're available to give a hand, drop by when you can. If you can't help, but have blooming orchids we can use in our display, please bring them to Fort Mason by 2 PM on set-up day (Wed. 2/20). Or you can drop off plants at one of our drop off locations:

Be sure to call first to see if anyone is home to receive your plants.

If you are planning to loan a plant(s) to the show, here are some things to note: 1) Do not put plants in baskets or special containers unless they are needed to prop up the plants. 2) All supports need to be natural material like bamboo (no metal or plastic). 3) Plants should be clean and bug-free. 4) Trim and remove any blackened or discolored spots. 5) Put your name on the pot with the help of a piece of masking tape (also put one on the bottom in case the one on the side falls off). 6) Bring a list of the plants you've brought so that we can keep track of what you've loaned. 7) Shine leaves using milk.
