Warmth Tolerant Miltoniopsis

The Pansy Orchid.

Usually people err by growing these too cool, which is good news for us out here on the western edge of the Great Sonoran Desert, aka the Great Central Valley of California. Forget all that noise about us being part of the San Francisco Bay Area. Balderdash! We have as much in common with their climate zones as fish do to bicycles. These newer 'warmth-tolerant' Miltoniopsis are grown intermediate to the cooler side of intermediate, well within the range for many indoor growers here in Contra Costa County.

Rob Terry last spoke to Diablo View on his first love, Phragmipediums. This time he'll show a few slides for an idea on what to expect of the color range and shapes of any Miltoniopsis species commonly used in breeding and their hybrids. Then he will give a cultural demonstration showing us how to repot these beauties. Additionally, he will take us the further step and show ways to plant out of flask into seedling cubes, then cubes to common pot sizes. He promises to divulge the secrets of transplanting techniques on how to get great specimen plants along with growing tips. Perhaps some of you have seen how truly magnificent these can be when grown to specimen size.

Rob will provide several warmth-tolerant plants for our raffle table. Please feel free to familiarize yourself with the web page so you can know what's on the raffle table. http://sherwoodorchids.com/Miltonia%20Page.html. Many of these are from breeding done by the Hawaiian nursery of Ivan N. Komoda. http://www.orchidmall.com/komoda/komoda2.htm Komoda Orchids commonly sells plants by the compot, so Rob's presentation will help you if you've ever wanted to try your hand at growing a smattering of them, ferreting out the special orchid flowers and choosing amongst them for your own collection. And pay for your habit by selling off the others! (That's the idea anyway, but I can never part with any of the ones I own! LOL!!)

January Recap, Novelty Phals

On January 8th the DVOS heard a great lecture on novelty phalaenopsis. Scott Collins conducted the lecture on the evolution of this modern day orchid. Scott defined the novelty phalaenopsis as a newer generation of phals whose flowers are smaller and more star shaped than regular phals. Huh! I thought the definition would be more complex than that.

Back in the 1970s and 80s the Bay Area was the hotbed of novelty phalaenopsis breeding. That all ended in the 90s when most of the major players either sold their property or passed away. Today all of the hybridizing has shifted to Taiwan.

Scott says there are 5-6 phalaenopsis species that are the backbone of the novelty breeding program. Phal hieroglyphica (lueddemaniana var. hieroglyphica) will give novelty reds with squiggles on the petals. Phal. violacea (bellina) will give novelties fragrance. Phal. Spica (fasciata x lueddemaniana) is responsible for improved shape and increased flower count. Phal. gigantea will breed flatter and rounder shaped flowers.

Scott says that most novelties will produce fewer flowers per spike than regular phals. Many times you will only get 1-2 flowers per spike but novelties usually make up for it by throwing multiple spikes. The end result is still a plant with a lot of show power. Try 'em, you'll like 'em! —Brad Piini

Cymbidiums in the Red – **Ray Dix**, has been growing orchids since 1975 and made his first hybrid in 1985. It was not until 1990 that the main thrust of his breeding program started to develop, focusing mainly on red standard Cymbidiums. A keen hobby grower, orchid judge and hybridizer, Ray will discuss some of his crosses and the reasons for making them.

Pendulous Miniature Cymbidiums – George Hatfield, owner of Hatfield Orchids, specializes in Cymbidium orchid seedlings and AOS & CSA award-winning plants. George is past CSA President and past president of the Santa Barbara International Orchid Show Board, He has published articles in the American Orchid Society *Awards Quarterly* and the Cymbidium Society of America *CSA Journal*. George is a judge for both the CSA and AOS, and is currently the Chairman of the Santa Barbara judging region for the CSA.

Warmth Tolerant Cymbidiums – **Milton Carpenter**, past president of the American Orchid Society, is co-owner of Everglades Orchids in Belle Glade, Florida. Their specialties are warmth tolerant Cymbidiums and Oncidium intergeneric hybrids. The hybridizing program he and his wife Nancy have been pursuing for the past 42 years has yielded more than 150 AOS awards.
